Repentance (#1)

We have just finished looking at love for God as a proof of salvation.

Such a love will, by the very nature of things, result in a hatred for sin...


... not just the sins of <u>others</u>, but even more so, <u>our own</u> sin.

People who recognize and love the beauty of God's glory ...





... will recognize and despise the ugliness and treachery of their own sin.



So... If we love and rejoice in GOD:

- The <u>love</u> of SIN will be IMPOSSIBLE for


 US
 - -We will hate and despise it.
- The <u>practice</u> of SIN will become utterly repulsive to us.

(We will also hate the "pull" that our sinful nature exerts, trying to drag us into sin.)

The results of our hatred for sin:

- We will change he way we think about sin.
- We will change our willingness to <u>participate</u> in sin.
- We will desire to do the will of the God we love.

In other words, we will...





- Most people:
 - They rarely use this word.
 - Some have no idea what it even means,
 except perhaps in a distorted way.
- What about us?


(= we who have been studying what "Assurance of Salvation" is all about)

- By now, we should know!









It may be something preached to the unsaved at a "revival meeting."

(= A more common situation.)

But how often is it preached to people who are *already* saved?



 Does repentance apply <u>only</u> to the unsaved?



Repentance applies to *ALL* people who are not *SINLESS*.

 Of course, this includes all <u>unsaved</u> people.

- It also includes all <u>saved</u> people who are still alive and living in this world.
 - Are you still alive? Then it includes YOU.
 - Only if you have died and entered the presence of Jesus, do you no longer need to repent.



BUT THE NATURE
OF THE REPENTANCE

How the **UNSAVED** need to repent


- This is the **initial step** that people must take, to follow Jesus. They must recognize their sinful ways and reject them.
- It involves a complete turn around.





How the **SAVED** need to repent (1)


- This is the ongoing process that is needed, in order to become more like Christ.
- They have already made the initial turnaround.





How the SAVED need to repent (2)

- · They still have sins and imperfections to deal with.
- Their repentance involves adjustments and corrections, to keep on the "straight and narrow."



Repentance is received as a **GIFT from God.**



God exalted [Jesus] ... that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel.

[They] praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted even the Gentiles repentance unto life." (Acts 11:18b NIV)

Yet it is also an act of human responsibility.

- So *DO IT*, rather than waiting until you "feel" that God is giving you the gift!
- But MAKE SURE that your repentance is *genuine*!



As with all of God's gracious gifts, there is a counterfeit: Remorse without change.

- Remorse <u>sorrow</u> about what has happened, but no actual change in values and conduct.
- Repentance includes *sorrow*, but also a change in the way we think and act.

Judas – a good example of remorse

Judas ... was filled with remorse. (Matthew 27:3a NLT)

· But instead of repentance, he went out and hanged himself.

> Then Judas .. went out and hanged himself.




Did hanging himself solve the problem?


NO!!!

Things only got worse.

"... Judas the traitor ... has deserted us and gone where he belongs." (Acts 1:25 NLT)







LESSONS WE LEARN

- Judas: Remorse (sorrow without change):
 - "When you reach the end of your rope, things will only get worse."
- Peter: Repentance (sorrow with change):
 - "With the humility of repentance, God will graciously lifted you from the 'pit' of sin you have fallen into."

(More about Peter)

• Jesus accepted Peter back.

[Jesus] said to [Simon Peter], "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Peter ... said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you."

Jesus said, "Feed my sheep. (John 21:17 NIV)

Paul describes it this way:

Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret,

but <u>worldly sorrow</u> brings death. [= ETERNAL DEATH]

(2 Corinthians 7:10 NIV)

= Like PETER



YOUR MISSION (if you have died)

If you are dead and have entered eternity:

YOU NO LONGER HAVE NEED TO REPENT

It's too late if you haven't already done so.

(Besides, if you're DEAD, why are you reading this?)

YOUR MISSION (if you are still alive)

If you are still alive and in this present world:

YOU NEED TO MAKE REPENTANCE A WAY OF LIFE

(Do it while you can!)

YOUR MISSION (the final realization)

- If your repentance is GENUINE:
 - It will be a <u>way of life</u> specifically, <u>YOUR</u> way of life.
 - It will be <u>evidence</u> that your <u>salvation</u> is genuine.
