

HOW are they different?

OPPONENTS
 will tell you to
 "affirm" yourself.



Self-denial is so "negative." God wants you to have a "positive" outlook!

 They may even say that "self-affirmation" is the "Christian" way!

 The <u>false gospel</u> often proclaims this message.



Counterfeits - FAKES

• FAKES

will affirm self-denial.

 Their "self-denial" will be a <u>substitute</u> or some other type of <u>distortion</u>.



Yes, this is the real thing!!

Jesus responds to fakeness in this passage:

[Jesus] replied, "Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites; as it is written:

'These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain;

their teachings are but rules taught by men.' "

(These leaders wanted others to follow their *man-made* rules.)

FAKES may go after substitutes of the real thing.

- They may <u>invent</u> their own rules and regulations in place of the commands of Scripture.

 We live by THAT MAI
- They may <u>blindly follow</u> the rules invented by others.



Praise NOW... Rewards LATER!

I'm so

FAKES may do the <u>right</u> things for the <u>wrong</u> reasons.

- A "show" of self-denial
 - ... without the "spirit" of self-denial.
- The right "motions"
 - ... without the right "motivations."
- WHY might they do this?



#1: Maybe because of PEER PRESSURE

- They may obey <u>Scripture</u>.
 - Because it is one of the "rules" that others expect them to follow.
 - Because they want to please others.
- · They may obey man-made rules.

Someone has described "PEERS" this way:

"PEERS" this way

P – People who E – encourage

E – errors,

R - rudeness, and

S – stupidity.

 Do you <u>really</u> want such people to rule YOUR life?




#2: Maybe because of SELF-LOVE

- They expect to reap <u>benefits</u> from self-denial.
 - Their focus is on personal gain.
- This is the opposite of having self-denial for the glory of God and love of neighbor.

QUESTION: Are there personal benefits from self-denial?

- If your ultimate interest is the honor and glory of God...
 - It will benefit you <u>forever</u> (whether or not you see that benefit <u>now</u>).
- If your ultimate interest is in personal gain...
 - You are indulging in "<u>self</u>-idolatry"; and your self-denial will get you <u>nothing</u> good.



* The Ultimate Reason *

- The reason for all this fakeness is because the Spirit of God is NOT in them.
- They may have all the "religion" the world can offer; but without repentance, they cannot be saved.

QUESTION YOURSELF

An OPPONENT?

1) Do you <u>oppose</u> self-denial?

If so, you simply are NOT following Jesus.

Inventing SUBSTITUTES?

2) Is your self-denial based on the teachings of Scripture? Can you prove it?

Jesus warns us that many people will be deceived.

QUESTION YOURSELF

WRONG MOTIVATION?

3) Do you have the wrong reasons for denying self?

Peer pressure? Love for self? You need to repent!

GENUINE?

4) Do you love God and neighbor <u>more than</u> yourself?

You're following Jesus; you're pursuing what is genuine.

Who do you live for?

For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died.

And he died for all, [we are convinced] that those who live <u>should no longer live for</u> <u>themselves but for him</u> who died for them and was raised again.

2 Cor. 5:14-15 (NIV)

That's JESUS!

Someone may ask:

"Is 'living for God' a realistic option?"

Scripture's response:

"YES, and there are many examples of people who have done so!"

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, ...

From Hebrews 12:1 (ESV)

Scripture is **PACKED** with examples!

Scripture is packed with **PAST EXAMPLES** of self-denial

Jesus himself is our #1 example.

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.

2 Cor. 8:9 (ESV)

(But there are so many *other* examples!)

Here is just one of the many other examples:

By faith Moses, when he had grown up, <u>refused</u> to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.

He <u>chose</u> to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time.

He <u>regarded</u> disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.

Hebrews 11:24-26 (NIV)

"Forward thinking"!

There are also **FUTURE EXAMPLES** of self-denial!

They overcame him [the devil]
by the blood of the Lamb
and by the word of their testimony;

they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death.

Rev. 12:11 (NIV)

When God says something about the <u>future</u>, it is simply HISTORY that hasn't yet happened... BUT IT WILL!

How about **PRESENT EXAMPLES** of self-denial?

[Make every effort to <u>become</u> the example!]
