
LOVE Without Hypocrisy (in the book of Romans) 59 – dearly loved

The only REAL question to ask is this:</u>






































OUR THEME VERSE CONTAINS THE PHRASE "MY FRIENDS." Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord. Romans 12:19-20 (NIV) • It can also be translated as "dear friends," or "beloved." • In the New Testament Greek language, this word is related to the word "LOVE," the theme of this entire section of Romans 12:9-21. It is a reminder that we are loved.

THIS COMMAND CAN BE QUITE DIFFICULT TO FOLLOW.



ESPECIALLY IN CASES OF EXTREME INJUSTICE

"DEAR FRIENDS" OR "BELOVED"

("One who is loved")

A New Testament concept of special significance, used *only* of Jesus Christ and of those who are united with him.

THE NEW TESTAMENT USE OF THE WORD

In "everyday" use (seen in some parables about Jesus).

 This word could used to describe close relationships, such as parent and child, family members, close friends, etc.

In the New Testament, before the cross.

The gospels have *much* to say about love. But this specific word "beloved" was used *only* in relation to *Jesus*, who came to save us and to restore our fellowship with God.

- Expressing the Father's supreme delight in him (and approval of what he would do for us) - Matthew 3:17; 12:18; 17:5; etc.
- Also found in parables about Jesus Mark 12:6; Luke 20:13.

In the New Testament, after the cross.

It is *because* of what Jesus has done, that we now have a special relationship with God and with each other.

 We are loved (beloved) by God - Romans 1:7; Ephesians 5:1 (as his children).

- Made possible by our union with Christ (by being "in the Lord") - Philemon 1:16; Ephesians 6:21; Romans 16:8; etc.
- The word may be used to address God's people in general 1 Corinthians 15:58; James 1:16; 1 John 4:7; Jude 1:17; etc.
- The word may be used to describe people who are faithful, who are characterized by service to God, and who hold firmly to the truth Colossians 1:7; 4:7, 9; Ephesians 6:21; 3 John 1:1; etc.
- The word may be used to address individuals who have a special relationship to the speaker Acts 15:25 (Barnabas and Paul, who were given a special mission); Romans 16:5 (Paul's first convert to Christ from Asia); 2 Timothy 1:2 (Paul's spiritual "son"); 1 Timothy 6:2 (a slave's master, if both are saved); 2 Peter 3:15 (Paul, as a gifted teacher); etc.
- The word was often used when an apostle was about to address God's people about a matter of great importance (and sometimes difficult to accept). It was a reminder that the instructions were spoken out of love. (But not using that word does not make the apostle's instructions any less important!)

MATTERS OF GREAT IMPORTANCE - SOMETIMES INTRODUCED BY REMINDING THE PEOPLE THAT THEY ARE "BELOVED"

- Rebuke and warnings against sin 1 Corinthians 10:14 (flee idolatry); James 1:16 (don't be deceived about sin); 1 Peter 2:11 (don't appease sinful desires); etc.
- Encouragement to be faithful and godly 2 Corinthians7:1 (strive for holiness); Jude 1:20 (growing in the faith); 1 John 4:7, 11 (the need to love each other); etc.
- (Other) 2 Peter 3:17 and 1 John 4:1 (warnings about false teachers); 2 Corinthians 12:19 (explaining one's motives); etc.

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
