















DO YOU CLAIM TO BE FOLLOWING JESUS...

WHEN THOSE CLOSEST TO YOU MAKE OBEYING THIS VERSE A CHALLENGE

It's easy to expect *unsaved* people to make obeying this verse difficult.

But what about people in the church?

"BROTHERS IN UNITY" ... OR NOT

- It's wonderful when harmony and unity exist within the church; it's terrible when conflict and discord are present.
- David wrote a Psalm that expresses how pleasant unity and harmony are (Psalm 133); Jesus prayed that his people would have perfect unity (John 17:22-23).
- Sadly, this unity is not always present. Perhaps most distressing is when a friend turns into an enemy such as David experienced (Psalm 41:9; 55:12-14, 20-21).
- Jesus experienced the worst example of being turned against by a friend. Judas, one of his twelve closest friends (Luke 6:13), who was trusted with the group's money (John 13:29a), who was among those chosen to proclaim the good news about the God's kingdom and to perform miracles (Mark 6:7; Luke 9:2) ... for a small amount of money, he was willing to hand Jesus over to those who would kill him (Mark 14).

THE ISSUE

There are a number of reasons that disunity may occur within the church. (Two main reasons are described below.) But when people are actually *following* Jesus (which *all* saved people will attempt to do), the disunity will be temporary. If it is just a matter of disagreement, they will work together for a solution. If it involves sin, there will be repentance. Even if, for some reason, reconciliation does not seem possible, there will at least be an attempt by those who are saved to resolve issues.

"Newborn" Christians.

- People who have just become saved will often not understand all that it means to "follow" Jesus. Much of the New Testament is directed toward them. (Example: 1 Corinthians.) They need to learn, and will be willing to do so. As they learn, and put to practice what they learn, issues of disunity and conflict will diminish.
- Even the apostles had to learn! Example: While Jesus was still training them, they had arguments (Mark 9:33-34)!
- Scripture tells us that we must grow to spiritual maturity.
 Remaining a "newborn" is not an option (Hebrews 5:11-6:3;
 1 Peter 2:2; 2 Peter 3:18).
- Once we are mature, we must be patient and encourage those who have further to grow (Ephesians 4:11-13; Colossians 4:12; 1 Thessalonians 5:14). Growing is not always easy (James 1:2-8)!

Fake "Christians."

• These are the ones who cause disharmony and divisions, and do *not* repent. Scripture describes them as divisive people, false brothers, wandering from the faith, people who persecute God's people, etc. We are to warn them (Titus 3:10-11); remove them from the church (1 Corinthians 5:13b); keep away from them (Romans 16:17; 2 Thessalonians 3:6); etc.
