■ Are you going to be OVERCOME?

OR...

• Are you going to be the OVERCOMER?

- Are you going to be OVERCOME?
 - If so → EVIL WINS! YOU LOSE!
 - ✓ Their evil now controls <u>you</u>. You have joined your enemies as a loser to evil.
 - ✓ If you claim <u>they</u> were wrong, you now condemn <u>yourself</u> (Romans 2:1).




✓ You have just given them an excuse to return evil for <u>your</u> evil... thus escalating the problem.

- Are you going to be the OVERCOMER?
 - If so --- GOOD WINS! YOU WIN!
 - √ You are living as one who has a transformed mind – Romans 12:2.
 - ✓ Your love becomes a picture of God's love toward sinners.
 - ✓ You are demonstrating victory over the evil in your own heart.
 - √ There will be less hate in the world: Though they may <u>hate</u> you, they won't be <u>hated by</u> you.

Are you going to <u>be the OVERCOMER?</u>

If so -> YOUR ENEMIES MIGHT WIN!

- ✓ Their evil will have NO power or control over vou.
- ✓ You might take away their incentive to do evil.
- ✓ If they repent, good may fill <u>their</u> lives. **Then** they also will become winners!





The word translated as "OVERCOME" has to do with "VICTORY."

Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.




[It's the SAME word group!] *

HOW USED	TYPICAL WAYS TRANSLATED
NOUN	VICTORY, VICTORIOUS
VERB (USED AS VERB)	OVERCOME, OVERPOWER, CONQUER, WIN THE VICTORY, ETC.
VERB (USED AS NOUN)	HE WHO OVERCOMES, THE VICTOR, THE CONQUEROR, ETC.

OVERCOMING AND VICTORY

in the New Testament

GOD / JESUS CHRIST - THE ULTIMATE VICTOR

- Jesus is the ultimate victor over all over this sinful world (John 16:33); over demonic forces (Luke 11:21-22, illustrated in a parable; see vs. 14-26); over the evil powers at the end of the age (Revelation 17:14).
- Jesus is the victor because he is the King of kings and Lord of lords (Revelation 17:14). He sits on the throne of God (Revelation 3:21b); and he is worthy of opening the "scroll" that brings this evil age to an end (Revelation 5:5).
- He is the one who will bring victory over injustice (Matthew 12:20). He can take from the devil what the devil claims as his own (Luke 11:21-22, illustrated in a parable; see vs. 14-26).
- Because of Jesus' victory, we can have peace and encouragement (John 16:33); we will share in Jesus' victory over the evil powers of this world (Revelation 17:14); and in the end, we will rule with him (Revelation 3:21).
- Nobody can accuse God of any wrongdoing; any who try will be proven false - God will prevail (have victory) over their accusations (Romans 3:4).

EVIL AND DEATH - THEIR "VICTORIES" ARE TEMPORARY

- Death's victory over God's people is only temporary; Jesus has had victory over death, and has given this victory to us, his people (1 Corinthians 15:54-55, 57).
- During the end times, the evil powers will have temporary victory over the world (Revelation 6:2). This will include power to be victorious over God's people (Revelation 11:7; 13:7); but we must remember that this victory is only temporary.

GOD'S PEOPLE - THE VICTORY OF THOSE WHO FOLLOW HIM

- Victory overcoming evil is an obligation for God's people (Romans 12:21). However, because they are God's people, this victory is a fact - over the devil (1 John 2:13-14; Revelation 12:11); over those empowered by false spirits, who attempt to pull us away from the truth (1 John 4:4).
- The victory of God's people includes victory over the evil
 "world system" (1 John 5:4-5, made possible because of our
 trust in Jesus); over the evil powers of the world (Revelation
 15:2, describing the victory of God's people during the end
 times); and over death itself (1 Corinthians 15:54-55, 57, the
 victory being given to us by God himself).
- God has many blessings in store for those who are willing to be victorious (Revelation 2:7, 11, 17, 26-29; 3:5-6, 12-13, 21-22; 21:7 - the context of each passage showing what the victory is over).

The only thing we can conclude...

• Those who choose to live for God are "more than victorious" in all things; we cannot lose (Romans 8:37).
