

THE SECOND COMMANDMENT

"You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below.

You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments."

Exodus 20:4-6 (NIV); also Deuteronomy 5:8-10.

- This commandment prohibits: The Representing God by images, as well as ② bowing down to them, or worshipping (serving) them.
- Doing these things is an expression of hatred toward God, and is the opposite of loving and obeying him.
 - ★ God's opposition to this sin is very intense. ★

⇒ This command prohibits the making of *physical* images of God.

God cannot be visibly portrayed in any way. It's simply not possible, without distorting who he is.

THIS SOUNDS LIKE AN EASY **COMMAND TO OBEY!** I'D NEVER BOW DOWN TO A STATUE!

ACTUALLY, IT'S EASY TO DISOBEY. "IMAGES" ARE NOT ALWAYS VISIBLE.

⇒ We also need to consider the issue of <u>non</u>-physical images.

- This is how *God* reveals himself not by something *visible**, but by words. These words reveal a non-physical image of who he is, what he does, our relationship to him, etc.
- This revelation about God given by God himself, and <u>not</u> an image we have made – is to be the basis for our worship and service.
 - * (God has revealed himself in Jesus called the "Word" in John 1:1. This event involved God taking on human flesh.)

"Non-physical" or "invisible" images is NOT a new concept!

⇒ We experience them every day!

- It occurs when we communicate with words whether spoken or read – or through various non-verbal ways of communication.
- In daily life, the image we perceive can be based on something factual, or it can be fictional in nature. It can be truthful, or it can be a lie.

THE WORDS..

"A BAG OF APPLES"

The accuracy of the mental image will depend on the words that are spoken.

THE MENTAL IMAGE. 000

Every time we misrepresent God - in word or thought we are guilty of violating the Second Commandment.

As with all the commandments, this Second Commandment represents a *category* of obligations, instructions and commands.

All of our obligations; all of God's instructions and commands

Can be placed into TEN categories: the Ten Commandments.

• If desired, we can group these things into even simpler categories.

All of our obligations; all of **God's instructions** and commands

Can be placed into TWO categories: the commands to love God and neighbor.

In many respects, the ten categories are more helpful for teaching us specific issues related to how we are to live.

⇒ How do YOU REPRESENT GOD? TO ME, GOD IS ... THE ISSUE IS: DOES **YOUR** DESCRIPTION OF [PLACE DESCRIPTION GOD MATCH GOD'S SELF-DESCRIPTION? HERE1. Your description of God ... Is it based on ... or on your God's truth.. opinions?

⇒ How does *GOD* represent himself? Through the *WORD*.

- Through the Word of God Scripture, which can be spoken or read.
- Through the Word of God Jesus Christ (called the Word, John 1:1+). Yet since Jesus is not presently on earth, the only <u>accurate</u> self-description of God is the Word in written form.

THE WORLD HATES BOTH OF THESE EXPRESSIONS OF THE "WORD."

- When people saw Jesus [the Word of God], they didn't like what they saw (i.e., what he communicated by what he said and did).
 So they killed him.
- When people are exposed to Scripture [the Word of God], they tend to reject it the same way people rejected Jesus [the Word of God].
- It is only by the grace of God that anyone accepts the Word of God for what it truly is.

THE WORD OF GOD IS LIVING.

Jesus is alive, though not physically present on earth.



Scripture is also alive. And powerful.

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any doubleedged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

Hebrews 4:12 (NIV)

The unfolding of Your words gives light; ...
Psalm 119:130a (BSB)

... His powerful word.

Hebrews 1:3b (BSB)

... the living and enduring word of God.

1 Peter 1:23b (BSB)

..the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe.

1 Thessalonians 2:13b (NIV)

⇒ THE WORD OF GOD (SCRIPTURE) IS GOD'S SELF-REVELATION.

- God is the ultimate author. (We have looked at this issue in the past.)
- This Word comes to us through the prophets and through Jesus Christ (by way of the apostles – which includes the apostle Paul).

On many past occasions and in many different ways, God spoke to our fathers through the prophets.

But in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son ..

Hebrews 1:1-2a (BSB)

(GIVEN
THROUGH THE

... the Holy Spirit ... will teach you [apostles] all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

John 14:26 (NIV)

...the commission God gave me [= Paul] to present to you the word of God in its fullness ..

Colossians 1:25b (NIV)

⇒ This is how God reveals himself, since the visible Jesus is not currently present.

 When we ① <u>proclaim</u> the Word of God, and ② <u>accept</u> what it says (which results in obeying it), and ③ <u>love</u> the God revealed in it ...

Then God's presence is among us!

But if an unbeliever or uninstructed person comes in while everyone is prophesying [= speaking the truth about God], he will be convicted and called to account by all, and the secrets of his heart will be made known. So he will fall facedown and worship God, proclaiming, "God is truly among you!"

1 Corinthians 14:24-25 (BSB)

The one who keeps God's commands lives in him, and he in them. And this is how we know that he lives in us: We know it by the Spirit he gave us.

1 John 3:24 (NIV)

If the Spirit is in us, his "fruit" (Galatians 5:22-23) will also be in us.

⇒ What does God's self-revelation (Scripture) tell us?

- We have 66 books (the Bible) that tell us about God (directly or indirectly). They reveal who God is, what he is like, his relation to us, etc.
 - ✓ What is he like? Who is he?
 - ✓ What is his relationship to creation? To us?
 - ✓ How does he interact with us? Examples of this.
 - ✓ How does he respond to our sin?
 - ✓ What is his will for us? Why?
 - ✓ What has he done in the past? In the present? What will he do in the future?
- God reveals all this (and more) about himself, in his Word.



This is the God we are to worship/serve and bow down before.



⇒ Any other supposed "IMAGE" OF GOD IS COUNTERFEIT.

• If it's not God's Word, it's an imagination.

Tell those who prophesy out of their own imagination: Hear the word of the LORD! This is what the Lord GOD says: Woe to the foolish prophets who follow their own spirit, yet have seen nothing.

Ezekiel 13:2b-3 (BSB); also v. 17+

 Old and New Testaments both warn us about false teachers and false prophets. It's an ongoing warning. [Are <u>you</u> watching out for such people? If not, then you won't recognize them when they come.]

Now there were also false prophets among the people, just as there will be false teachers among you.

2 Peter 2:1a (BSB)

... and many false prophets will arise and mislead many.

Matthew 24:11 (BSB)

 People can say what they want, and claim that their message is from God. But in the end, their dreamed-up stories will be smashed and burned. <u>God's Word will prevail!</u>

"Let these false prophets tell their dreams, but let my true messengers faithfully proclaim my every word. There is a difference between straw and grain!

Does not my word burn like fire?" says the LORD.

"Is it not like a mighty hammer that smashes a rock to pieces?

"Therefore," says the LORD, "I am against these prophets who steal messages from each other and claim they are from me. I am against these smooth-tongued prophets who say, 'This prophecy is from the LORD!' I am against these false prophets. Their imaginary dreams are flagrant lies that lead my people into sin. I did not send or appoint them, and they have no message at all for my people. I, the LORD have spoken!"

Jeremiah 23:28-32 (NLT)

"The prophets are prophesying lies in My name... I did not send them or appoint them or speak to them. They are prophesying to you a false vision, a worthless divination, the futility and delusion of their own minds."

"Do not listen to the words of the prophets who prophesy to you.

They are filling you with false hopes.

They speak visions from their own minds, not from the mouth of the LORD.

They keep saying to those who despise Me,
'The LORD says that you will have peace,
and to everyone who walks in the stubbornness of his own heart,
'No harm will come to you.'

Jeremiah 14:14; 23:16–17 (BSB)

 People may *like* what the false teacher says; but their acceptance of those words does <u>not</u> make those words truthful.

For a time is coming when people will no longer listen to sound and wholesome teaching. They will follow their own desires and will look for teachers who will tell them whatever their itching ears want to hear. They will reject the truth and chase after myths.

2 Timothy 4:3-4 (NLT)

I LOVE PROSPERITY AND BLESSING!

A LOVING GOD WOULD <u>NEVER</u> SEND PEOPLE TO HELL!!

JUST TELL ME THAT GOD LOVES ME THE WAY I AM! I DON'T LIKE BEING TOLD I HAVE TO TURN AWAY FROM SIN!

SIN, REPENTANCE AND JUDGMENT ... TOO NEGATIVE! Their message may be popular; but when it's <u>not</u> based on Scripture, that's what matters.

For they mouth empty, boastful words and, by appealing to the lustful desires of the flesh, they entice people who are just escaping from those who live in error.

2 Peter 2:18 (NIV)

IT SOUNDS SO
WONDERFUL AND
ENCOURAGING!

- [UNFORTUNATELY, IT'S *FALSE* ENCOURAGEMENT.]

⇒ WARNING:

- If one's message is in any way <u>different</u> from God's revelation in Scripture, it's FALSE.
- If it's identical to the message of Scripture, then it's not needed. In that case, WE MIGHT AS WELL GO DIRECTLYTO SCRIPTURE, rather than placing our faith in what humans say!

It's easy for people to have a false non-physical image of God.

- ⇒ The PROBLEM is our *sinfulness...* which results in a <u>natural</u> inclination for us to break the Second Commandment!
 - It is <u>natural</u> for us to NOT like the way God describes himself.
 - It is <u>natural</u> for us to want to replace the true God with an image that more closely resembles what we want in a god.
 - ✓ In the past, people often represented that "image" with a physical object.
 - ✓ Today, we tend to represent it with a <u>non-physical</u> (mental) image.
 - Even when we base our views about God on the Bible, it is <u>natural</u> for us to focus on the descriptions we <u>like</u>, and to downplay or ignore those we <u>don't like</u>.

HOW ABOUT SOME EXAMPLES?

~~~

⇒ It is natural for people to NOT like the way God reveals himself. EXAMPLES:

• The Second Commandment itself is an example!

"You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below.

You shall not bow down to them or worship them;

for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the parents to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me,

but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments."

Exodus 20:4-6 (NIV); also Deuteronomy 5:8-10.

People tend to like the "love to a thousand generations" part (even if they <u>don't</u> love and obey God!) ... but they take offense with the "jealous" and "punishing the children" parts. Here's another example – God's "self disclosure" of who he is:

And [God] passed in front of Moses, proclaiming,

"The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious
 God, slow to anger, abounding in love and
 faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and
 forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin.

Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he
 punishes the children and their children for the sin of
 the parents to the third and fourth generation."

Exodus 34:6-7 (NIV)

Many people take offense with the "punishment" part.

But how does a God-honoring person respond?

Moses bowed to the ground at once and worshiped.

Exodus 34:8 (NIV)

The Second Commandment warns us: False depictions of God are expressions of HATE. "... those who hate me... ' Exodus 20:5b (NIV); also Deuteronomy 5:9b. TO ME, IT'S JUST A MATTER BUT I DON'T CALL OF MAKING GOD RELEVANT TO MODERN TIMES! IT "HATE"! **UNSAVED PEOPLE WANT A** 'FORGIVING" GOD, NOT ONE If this WHO JUDGES THEM! represents your attitude It would be better to find out $\underline{\textit{why}}$ these are characteristics of God, than to ignore, oppose, or lie about them. (We will look at this issue in the future.)

When we reject God's self-revelation of who he is:

⇒ BEWARE THE DANGER!

- Today, there are many false teachers all over the world, who
 proclaim a different "revelation" of God. Don't be surprised. God
 warned us about such terrible times 2 Timothy 3:1; 2 Peter 3:3.
- A terrible judgment awaits them... and those who listen to them.
- These people may be sincere. They may be self-deceived into thinking that they are proclaiming God's words. This means ...
- False teachers and false prophets don't always know they are false!
 For many, the day of judgment will be one of <u>surprise</u> and terror.

"Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and in your name perform many miracles?' Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!'

Matthew 7:22-23 (NIV)

 Watch out for them! Their followers will also have a horrible judgment waiting for them. (Compare to Matthew 23:13, 15; 2 Peter 2:18; Acts 20:29-31; Romans 16:18; etc.) ⇔ One more thing:

HAVING A CORRECT "IMAGE" OF GOD MEANS MORE THAN HAVING A KNOWLEDGE OF THE RIGHT FACTS!

- It's not just a matter of having the right facts (or "image" of God).
 We need to have the right response to those facts!
- This is where the Second Commandment's words about "bow down" and "worship/serve" find their significance. These are action words.
- Even demons have the "fact" part figured out. They know the truth (James 2:19)! Their problem is that they lack the necessary obedience and love for God.
- Without the proper response to how God images himself, we might as well go around bragging that our views about God are as good as the demon's views!

You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder. James 2:19 (NIV)

YOUR Mission!

⇒ God has revealed to us an <u>accurate</u> image of who he is.

 Search the Scriptures!
 Discover that image, and respond properly to it!

Worship, serve, and bow down to the God who has revealed ("imaged") himself in Scripture!

★ Tolerate no substitutes! ★
