

ABOUT NAMES.

- A person's name represents the person his essence, his significance... all that he is.
- Though not always the case, there were many instances in the Bible, in which a person's name had a special significance or meaning (which might pertain to the person, an event, or perhaps something else). Sometimes names were changed (or a second name given) for this purpose.

EXAMPLE (a second name):

Jesus looked at Simon and said, "You are Simon, son of John. Your name will be Cephas" (which means "Peter").

John 1:42b (GW)

"Cephas" (Aramaic) and "Peter" (Greek) both mean "rock."


THE NAMES OF GOD / JESUS.

- These names are 100% significant; and are one of the ways God has revealed himself to us. Through these names, we learn a lot about his essence, his nature – who he is, what he does, etc.
- To truly know his name is something which goes beyond being able to utter the consonants and vowels that form his name. It requires a response from us: It brings us into a special relationship to him – one that affects the way we think and live.
- In the Old Testament: The "name" of God is "Yahweh" in some translations, "Jehovah" or "LORD" (in capital letters).
- In the New Testament: The "name" of God is "Father, Son and Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19) – though the word "God" can apply to any of them.

THE NAMES USED IN BAPTISM.

- In Matthew 28:19: Baptism in the "name" of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit points to our relationship with the true God

 who he is, what he has done, its application to us, etc.
- In Acts: Baptism in the "name" of Jesus points to the one who
 made possible our new relationship with God. Additional terms,
 may be added, which tell us more about him.
 - "Christ" Jesus was the one chosen by God for accomplishing this.
 - √ "Lord" Jesus is our master, the one we serve.



BAPTIZED INTO WHO'S NAME?

The only thing that seems definite is that the "name" had to do with God/Jesus.

- · Baptism was NOT done in the name of a human!
 - ⇒ <u>All</u> Scripture passages that describe the "name" refer to God or Jesus; <u>none</u> point to people. As Paul said...

Were any of you baptized in the name of Paul? Of course not! I thank God that I did not baptize any of you except Crispus and Gaius [and the household of Stephanas – v. 16], for now no one can say they were baptized in my name.

1 Corinthians 1:13b-15 (NLT)

>> THIS IS BECAUSE <<

⇒ We are to follow GOD/JESUS, not PEOPLE!

THE "NAMES" THAT ARE THE FOCUS OF OUR BAPTISM:

BAPTIZED IN/INTO GOD'S NAME...

 This focuses in our relationship with God (Father/Son/Holy Spirit as mentioned in Matthew 28:19). We are no longer God's enemies, but have been adopted into his family (Ephesians 1:5; 1 Peter 4:17; 1 John 3:1-3). But this is true only because of our union with Christ.

BAPTIZED IN/INTO JESUS' NAME...

- It symbolizes our union with him. We are "in" him (and he "in" us).
- Among other things, it shows a very close relationship between
 Jesus and us (his disciples). We accept everything that Scripture
 says about him who he is, what he has done, etc. He is our
 leader; we want to follow him and learn from him. He has first
 place in our lives.

BAPTISM IN THESE "NAMES" IMPLIES OBLIGATIONS ON OUR PART.

- It's not just a focus on facts about God/Jesus. It's also about our relationship to him.
 - ✓ I accept what the Bible says.
 - ✓ I accept God/Jesus for who he is.
 - ✓ I have chosen to follow him.
 - ✓ I reject my former way of life.
 - ✓ I trust him and I rely on him for my salvation, as well as for knowing how to live my daily life.

These names have a significance that goes far beyond baptism.

WHO JESUS IS - HIS "NAME" - IS TO INFLUENCE ALL OF LIFE!

- In his name, we are to tell others the Good News (Acts 9:27-28; even when people try to stop us – Acts 5:40); and preach repentance and forgiveness (Luke 24:47).
- In his name, we are washed, made holy, and justified (1 Corinthians 6:11); we believe in his name (John 1:12; 2:23; etc.); we receive life (John 20:31); we have hope (Matthew 12:21).
- In his name, God's people meet together (1 Corinthians 5:4); we are to give thanks (to the Father) for all things (Ephesians 5:20); we are to pray for the sick and anoint them with oil (James 5:14).
- In his name, evil spirits are commanded to leave (Acts 16:18); we are to avoid those who choose to ignore Paul's instructions (2 Thessalonians 3:6).
 - * All that we do is to be done in his name (Colossians 3:17). *

WHO JESUS IS - HIS "NAME" - WILL IMPACT ALL OF ETERNITY!

The <u>name</u> of Jesus... something that will bring all humanity to its knees!

every knee will bow—

and under the earth—


