Learning the basics about being saved: Studying the Bible to find out (5).

Ways to STUDY the Bible.

> To get an overview. <

For a basic overview of Scripture, we can simply read it through, without stopping for in-depth study. An easy-to-read translation is often helpful – or even an audio version.

> To grow in understanding. <

Two common ways are: ① looking at Scripture passages (paragraphs, chapters or entire books), and ② looking at specific issues (words and topics). This is where we apply the basic Bible Study method.

Don't limit yourself to passages or issues you *like* – to the neglect of those that make you uncomfortable. If you do, you will never grow in a full knowledge of the truth. (Even *false teachers* can focus on *half* of the truth – the half they like to hear.)

A BASIC METHOD FOR UNDERSTANDING SCRIPTURE.

We're looking at a basic and valuable starting point for studying the Bible, using the "save/salvation" concept to illustrate it.

We need to pay attention to:

- 1 The words and their meanings.
- (2) How those words connect.
- 3 The context of the passage.
- 4 What other passages say.

IN THE FUTURE, DO YOU EXPECT ME TO DO PREPOSITION WORD STUDIES?

ABSOLUTELY NOT! JUST PAY ATTENTION TO THEM AS YOU STUDY OTHER CONCEPTS!

There is no need to memorize all the prepositions and their definitions! Just pay careful attention to the words you find in the passage you are studying.

PREPOSITIONS CONNECTED TO THE SAVE/SALVATION CONCEPT.

(We will omit the preposition "OF" – since we looked at it last time.)

OUR GOAL is to demonstrate how important even "insignificant" words are! Without such words, our understanding of God's Word would be very minimal – shallow, at best!

 A realization that <u>all</u> the words are important will greatly benefit us in our Bible study – even if we don't know the "official" names for the various word forms.

Sometimes, a verse may be difficult to understand, unless we look beyond the words ⇒ to the context and other Scripture passages. *In this presentation, we will limit our comments* about such verses. (We illustrated this issue more extensively in the previous presentation.)

What do prepositions teach us about the "SAVE/SALVATION" CONCEPT?



1. "TO" teaches us about the SAVIOR.

✓ The <u>Savior</u> Jesus – brought by God TO the nation Israel, as promised in the Old Testament – Acts 13:23. [The Good News about this Savior is for both Jews and non-Jews.]



1. "TO" teaches us about SALVATION.

- ✓ Salvation belongs TO our God and the Lamb [= Jesus] Revelation 7:10. [It belongs to him... and he offers it to us. He gets full credit for our salvation.]
- ✓ Salvation is brought TO all people (by God's grace, which teaches us how to live) – Titus 2:11. [The context has to do with different social classes. All can be saved. But only those who are willing to learn what God's grace teaches will be

saved.]

2. "WITH" teaches us about SALVATION.

✓ <u>Salvation</u> is to be "worked *out*" [not "worked *for*"] **WITH** fear and trembling – Philippians 2:12. [God is at work in you, to make this "working out" possible – v. 13.]

3. "THROUGH" teaches us about SALVATION.

- ✓ <u>Salvation</u> is **THROUGH** our Lord Jesus Christ 1 Thessalonians 1:9.
- ✓ <u>Salvation</u> is **THROUGH** sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth - 2 Thessalonians 2:13.
- ✓ <u>Salvation</u> is **THROUGH** faith in Christ Jesus 2 Timothy 3:15.

4. "IN" teaches us about SALVATION.

- ✓ Salvation is IN Christ Jesus 2 Timothy 2:10.
- ✓ <u>Salvation</u> is IN no one else Acts 4:12.



1. "WITH" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> WITH a holy calling 2 Timothy 1:9. [We have a God-honoring life to live!]
- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> WITH difficulty (trials, hardships, discipline, etc.) 1 Peter 4:18.

2. "IN" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

✓ We are saved IN this hope (the future redemption of our bodies, v. 23) – Romans 8:24. [Our *present* salvation is accompanied by a confident hope regarding the future.]

3. "THROUGH" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

- ✓ God sent Jesus to <u>save</u> the world **THROUGH** him John 3:17. [Those unwilling to trust Jesus will remain unsaved – vs. 18, 36.]
- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> THROUGH the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ Acts 15:11.
- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> from God's wrath THROUGH Christ Romans 5:9.
- ✓ By grace, we have been <u>saved</u> THROUGH faith Ephesians 2:8.

4. "BY" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

- ✓ We are saved BY God's grace Ephesians 2:5,8.
- ✓ We will be <u>saved</u> BY Jesus' life Romans 5:10.
- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> BY the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit - Titus 3:5.
- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> BY the Good News, if we hold firmly to the message Paul preached - 1 Corinthians 15:2.

5. "ACCORDING TO" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

- ✓ We are <u>saved</u> (and called to a holy life) NOT <u>ACCORDING TO</u> our own works, but ACCORDING TO God's purpose and grace -2 Timothy 1:9.
- ✓ He <u>saved</u> us NOT because of good deeds we have done, but ACCORDING TO his mercy - Titus 3:5.

6. "FROM" teaches us about SAVE/SAVING.

- ✓ Jesus would <u>save</u> his people **FROM** their sins Matthew 1:21. [Prophecy before his birth.]
- ✓ Peter told the Jews to <u>save</u> themselves FROM "this corrupt generation" by trusting Jesus – Acts 2:40. [They were to reject the world and its sinful ways, and thus escape its coming judgment.]
- ✓ Through Jesus, we will be saved FROM God's wrath Romans 5:9.
- √ The repentant sinner will be <u>saved</u> FROM death James 5:20.

What OTHER CONCEPTS do prepositions connect to "SAVE/SALVATION"?



1. "TO" connects other concepts to the SAVIOR.

✓ Glory, majesty, power and authority belong TO God our Savior Jude 1:25.

2. "FOR" connects other concepts to the SAVIOR.

✓ We eagerly wait FOR a <u>Savior</u>, the Lord Jesus Christ – Philippians



1. "TO" connects other concepts to SALVATION.

- Godly sorrow results in repentance that leads TO <u>salvation</u> 2 Corinthians 7:10.
- ✓ The Bible is able to give us the necessary wisdom that leads TO <u>salvation</u> 2 Timothy 3:15.

2. "IN" connects other concepts to SALVATION.

- ✓ Confessing Jesus results IN <u>salvation</u> Romans 10:10. [Trust is also involved.]
- ✓ We must crave God's Word, in order to grow up IN our <u>salvation</u> – 1 Peter 2:2.

3. "FOR" connects other concepts to SALVATION.

- ✓ The **Good News** is God's power **FOR** <u>salvation</u> Romans 1:16.
- ✓ Paul's desire for the Jews was FOR their <u>salvation</u> Romans 10:1.
- √ They were chosen FOR <u>salvation</u> 2 Thessalonians 2:13. [It was proved by ① the effects of the Spirit's presence, and by ② their acceptance of the truth of Scripture.]
- √ We are shielded/protected by God's power (through faith) FOR the <u>salvation</u> that is coming in the "last time."
- √ When Christ returns, he will come FOR the <u>salvation</u> of those who are eagerly waiting for him – Hebrews 9:28.

4. "ABOUT" connects other concepts to SALVATION.

✓ The prophets tried to understand what they could ABOUT this <u>salvation</u> – 1 Peter 1:10.

When the word "TO" is used with "save/saving" – as in "to save" – the word "TO" is <u>not</u> being used as a preposition. It is an <u>infinitive</u> ("TO + verb").

1. The infinitive "TO SAVE" teaches us:

- ✓ Jesus came **TO** seek/<u>save</u> the lost Luke 19:10.
- ✓ Jesus came TO <u>save</u> the world, not to judge it John 12:47.
- ✓ Christ Jesus came TO <u>save</u> sinners 1 Timothy 1:15.
- ✓ God desires all people TO be <u>saved</u> and to know the truth –
 1 Timothy 2:4.
- ✓ God uses what the world calls a "foolish" message TO <u>save</u> those who believe it 1 Corinthians 1:21.
- ✓ There is one lawgiver/judge, who is able TO <u>save</u>/destroy lames 4:12.

Your MISSION:

Pay attention to how words connect!

- Obviously, the "big" words are important. But without the "little" words, the "big" words don't communicate

 much
- We have focused on "little" words (such as conjunctions and prepositions) in order to show the importance of <u>all</u> the words.
