


The role of "<u>God's</u> sovereignty" in salvation... not the world's counterfeit type of "sovereignty."


Proclaiming the GOOD NEWS in the Book of Acts

- If the APOSTLES didn't understand the GOOD NEWS, then NONE of us do!
- If OUR "good news" doesn't agree with theirs, then WE are in the wrong!












- THE WORLD TEACHES: God's sovereignty and human responsibility work <u>AGAINST</u> each other.
- THE BIBLE TEACHES: God's sovereignty and human responsibility work <u>WITH</u> each other.

Because of the world's influence, we tend to view them as incompatible *opposites*.

It may take some time to undo what we learned from the world, before we can see them as working together.









Since sovereignty and responsibility work together...

Our choice to pursue salvation will be a genuine endeavor on our part.

[Peter] warned them; and he pleaded with them, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation."

Acts 2:40b (NIV)

Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.

1 Tim. 4:16 (NIV)

To those who by persistence in doing good seek glory, honor and immortality, he will give eternal life.

But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger.

Romans 2:7-8 (NIV)

At the same time, we will give God credit for our salvation... and rejoice in what he has done!

He saved us, not because of the good things we did, but because of his mercy. He washed away our sins and gave us a new life through the Holy Spirit.

Titus 3:5 (NLT)

For by grace you are saved through faith, and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so that no one can boast.

For we are his workmanship, having been created in Christ Jesus for good works that God prepared beforehand so we may do them.

Eph 2:8-10 (NET)

God has given repentance resulting in life even to the Gentiles.

Ac 11:18b (CSB)

Sovereignty guarantees the significance of

everything – what <u>God</u> does for us, what <u>we</u> do... and what <u>the unsaved</u> do.

God working for us (his people).

. God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on that day when Christ Jesus comes back again.

Philip. 1:6b (NLT)

Us working for God.

Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

1 Cor. 15:58b (NIV)

The works of the unsaved.

God's sovereignty, as related to the <u>worst</u> evil ever committed, does <u>not</u> remove the responsibility of those involved.

This man [Jesus] was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead,

Acts 2:23-24b (NIV)

Nor does it remove their obligation to repent.

When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins.

Acts 2:37-38a (NIV)

When we pay attention to what Scripture tells us about sovereignty and responsibility working together ...

- We can see that they do work together.
- We may learn some aspects of <u>how</u> they work together.

BUT...

- We shouldn't expect to understand <u>everything</u> about it.
 - ❖ We are limited creatures, not the infinite Creator.
 - This calls for humility and trust on our part.

YOUR OPPORTUNITY

IF YOU ARE NOT SAVED: Focus on your responsibility.

- You need to <u>repent</u> and <u>trust</u> Jesus for salvation and for the ability to obey him.
- IF YOU REFUSE, then you should <u>fear</u> God's sovereignty... because God guarantees that you will reap the consequences of your choice.

IF YOU ARE SAVED: You can rejoice in sovereignty!

- The good work God began in you will be someday completed!
- ➤ He will reward you for the good work you did for him.
