

THE NEW TESTAMENT GREEK WORD GROUP TRANSLATED AS "FAITH, TRUST, BELIEVING": • Occurs nearly 600 times, and includes a variety of related concepts: ✓ Faith, trust, believing. FAITH WHITH THE MAN CHUMINA √ "The faith" (what the Bible teaches) ✓ Faithful, faithfulness, trustworthy. TRUST THE HIM ME IN MINING THE NITH ✓ Opposites: unbelief, unfaithful. THAT HATHA BELIEVE WHITH THE THE THE THE THI THI THI HILLINI • Easy to translate. This means: ✓ It is not an obscure topic. ✓ We do not need special training or knowledge of New Testament languages, before we can understand what faith/trust/believing is all about. THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THIS FACT





THE BIBLE SOMETIMES USES THE SINGLE CONCEPT OF "BELIEVING"
TO REPRESENT THE WHOLE PROCESS OF SALVATION.

More men and women than ever began to believe in the Lord.

Acts 5:14 (GW)

Timothy's mother was a Jewish believer, ...

Acts 16:1b (GW)

But it can omit the word "believe," and use other concepts just as well.

[God] commands all people everywhere to repent.

Acts 17:30b (NIV)

(This does not imply that the unmentioned concepts are less important, or can be omitted.)

SOME EXAMPLES OF HOW FAITH/TRUST/BELIEVING FIT WITHIN THE "PROCESS OF SALVATION"

- ❖ Since faith/trust/believe all represent the *same* New Testament concept, any of them may occur within a specific
- ❖ The words "faith" and "believe" are so often misused by the society we live in, that it may help us if we use the word "trust" in their place (when it fits the context).

EXAMPLE: "believe in Jesus" ⇒ "put your trust in Jesus."

#1 Conviction ⇒ ⇒ ⇒ The foundation that Becoming aware of what Scripture says and accepting it [Paul and Silas] shared the word of the Lord with [the jailer] and all who lived in his household. ... He and his entire household rejoiced because they all believed in God. Acts 16:32, 34b (NLT) ... the proconsul believed, because he was astonished at the teaching of the Lord. Acts 13:12b (CSB)

Sometimes a sign or extraordinary event occurred as a "pointer" to the Good News message, or to reinforce it.

GOD (USING PETER) HEALED A CRIPPLED MAN

... instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong.

[The Good News proclaimed (3:12-26); then the apostles were seized and put in jail (4:1-3).]

But many who heard the message believed, ...

Acts 3:7b; 4:4a (NIV)

GOD (USING PAUL) MADE THE SORCERER TEMPORARILY BLIND

Then, when he saw what happened, the proconsul believed, because he was astonished at the teaching of the Lord.

Acts 13:12 (CSB)

⇒ ⇒ ⇒ ⇒ ⇒ The things WE do just #2 Change before and after it.

❖ Repentance – the other internal change – begins before faith/believing can occur. (Some aspects appear to overlap.)

> Repent, then, and turn to God. ... [And] many who heard the message believed, ...

> > Acts 3:19a: 4:4a (NIV)

I have declared to both Jews and Greeks that they must turn to God in repentance and have faith in our Lord Jesus.

Acts 20:21 (NIV)

The Lord's hand was with them, and a large number who believed turned to the Lord.

Acts 11:21 (CSB)

❖ Baptism, an external expression of change comes after faith/believing occurs.

But now the people believed Philip's message of Good News ... As a result, many men and women were baptized.

Acts 8:12 (NLT)

Many Corinthians who heard Paul believed and were baptized.

Acts 18:8b (GW)

- There are some things we <u>start</u> doing as an external expression of this change. But then we *continue* doing them as a consequence of salvation.
 - > One example (obedience) is listed in the next section.

#3 Consequences ⇔⇔⇔ What comes

❖ Some consequences are *visible* to other people. If the "believing" is genuine, consequences such as these will be present.

THERE WILL BE CHANGES THAT CAN BE DESCRIBED AS "VISIBLE EVIDENCE OF GOD'S GRACE" IN OUR LIVES


... a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord. ... [Barnabas] arrived and saw the evidence of the grace of God, ..

Acts 11:21b, 23a (NIV)

OBEDIENCE TO THE GOOD NEWS MESSAGE

... a large group of priests became obedient to the faith.

Acts 6:7b (CSB)
