







We believe/trust the BIBLE.

Without it, we have <u>no</u> ability to understand <u>anything</u> about genuine faith and salvation.

It is also the power that God uses to accomplish his work in us.

⇒ A REMINDER: It's from God and it's God's power.

THE GOOD NEWS IS GOD'S <u>POWER</u> FOR SAVING PEOPLE.

... the Good News. It is God's power to save everyone who believes...

Romans 1:16b (GW)

POWER <u>FROM GOD</u>; CONTINUES TO WORK IN THE LIVES OF SAVED PEOPLE.

When you received God's word from us, you realized it wasn't the word of humans. Instead, you accepted it for what it really is—the word of God. This word is at work in you believers.

1 Thes. 2:13b (GW)

The Bible's description of itself is completely different from the way the world views it. Here is the view that God's people take: All Scripture is God-breathed... Every word of God proves true. 2 Tim. 3:16a (NIV) Proverbs 30:5a (NLT) For the word of God is living and active... Hebrews 4:12a (NET) For you have been born No prophecy ever originated again... through the living and from humans. Instead, it enduring word of God. was given by the Holy Spirit as humans spoke under 1 Peter 1:23 (NIV) God's direction. This word can save you. 2 Peter 1:21 (GW) James 1:21b (GW) He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, ... James 1:18a (NIV)

Since we've looked at many of the Bible issues in the past, we will limit ourselves to a few passages related specifically to faith/trust/believing.

⇒ The BIBLE reveals to us what we must believe (facts and obligations).

THE FACTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE GOOD NEWS:
IT'S WHAT THE APOSTLES AND OTHER CHRISTIAN LEADERS TAUGHT.

... they **believed** Philip as he preached the good news...

Acts 8:12b (NIV)

Whether, then, it is I or they, so we proclaim and so you have **believed**.

1 Corinthians 15:11 (CSB)

IT'S WHAT WE ARE TO BELIEVE (AND RESPOND PROPERLY TO).

"Repent and believe the good news!" Mark 1:15b (CSB) ... you believed the testimony we gave you.

2 Thes. 1:10b (GW)

⇒ The words of the prophets were fulfilled in Jesus. We will accept <u>both</u> (the prophets and Jesus) or <u>neither</u>.

MOSES AND THE PROPHETS WROTE ABOUT THE MESSIAH/CHRIST (= JESUS).

[Jesus] said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?"

And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

Luke 24:25-27 (NIV)

PEOPLE WHO ACCEPT WHAT THE OLD TESTAMENT SAYS WILL ACCEPT JESUS.

"But if you had believed Moses, you would have believed me because he wrote about me. And since you don't believe what he wrote, how will you believe what I say?"

John 5:46-47 (NLT)

The SIGNIFICANCE of our BIBLE focus?

Though all creation teaches us about God, our suppression of that revelation (Romans 1:18+) has distorted our thinking. We need <u>Scripture</u> (and its power) to correct our perceptions about God.

Furthermore, creation was not designed to teach us about salvation and forgiveness. We need <u>the Good News</u> to tell us about that!

DO YOU WANT THE BARRIER BETWEEN YOU AND GOD TO BE REMOVED?

Cling to the Good News message and don't let qo!

[You must] continue in faith without being moved from the solid foundation of the hope that the Good News contains. You've heard this Good News of which I, Paul, became a servant. It has been spread throughout all creation under heaven.

Col. 1:23 (GW)

We believe/trust GOD.

We are referring specifically to the God who is revealed in the BIBLE. We must reject any "god concept" we have that contradicts what the Bible reveals about God.

⇒ We must be willing to admit that this God exists, and that he made us.

We must be willing to <u>stop</u> suppressing the truth of Scripture! (Implied: We must reject all other "gods.")

No one can please God without faith. Whoever goes to God must believe that God exists ...

Hebrews 11:6a (GW)

By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

Hebrews 11:3 (CSB)

Our "belief" in God must go <u>beyond</u> merely admitting that he exists. We must <u>trust</u> him with our lives.

No one can please God without faith. Whoever goes to God must believe ... that he rewards those who seek him.

Hebrews 11:6 (GW)

[The jailer] and his entire household rejoiced because they all believed in God.

Acts 16:34b (NLT)

... we have put our trust in him. 1 John 4:16b (NLT) I trust God ... Acts 27:25b (GW)

MERELY ADMITTING THAT GOD "EXISTS" IS SOMETHING THAT
EVEN DEMONS DO! (But they don't repent and trust him.)

Even the demons believe that—and tremble with fear.

James 2:19b (NET)

The SIGNIFICANCE of our GOD focus?

We cannot be saved if we are following a fake god!
We need to surrender our pretensions and pursue the God who
created us.

This is the God we have sinned against. At the same time, this God is the only one who has power to save us. But for this to happen...

We need to come to God through Jesus Christ.

[Jesus] is able to save completely those who come to God through him, ...

Hebrews 7:25b (NET)

THIS BRINGS US TO OUR NEXT FOCUS!

We believe/trust JESUS.

There is a uniqueness about Jesus that qualifies him to be our mediator (or "go-between"), so that we can have restored fellowship with God.

We do not have to fully understand this uniqueness (though we should be willing to learn what we can). But Scripture tells us that Jesus is <u>both</u> the righteous <u>God</u> and sinless <u>man</u>.

Jesus has also accomplished all that the Old Testament said he would accomplish (except for those things that are related to his <u>future</u> return to earth).

The Word [Jesus] became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 1:14 (NIV)

⇒ We must acknowledge that there is a special relationship between Jesus (as the "Son") and the Father.

A SPECIAL UNION BETWEEN FATHER AND SON *

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Don't you believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words I say are not my own, but my Father who lives in me does his work through me.

John 14:10 (NLT); see also John 10:38

WHEN JESUS PRAYED FOR THE APOSTLES:

They knew with certainty that I came from you, and they believed that you sent me.

John 17:8b (NIV)

Then Jesus said loudly, "Whoever believes in me believes not only in me but also in the one who sent me.

John 12:44 (GW)

* We are also called "sons" of God. But our sonship is by <u>adoption</u> (Ephesians 1:5), whereas Jesus is the Son by <u>nature</u> (Philip. 2:6).

⇒ Examples of specific things to be believed about Jesus.

"... that they may believe that <u>you</u> [= the Father] <u>sent me</u>." John 11:42b (NIV) "We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."

John 6:69 (NIV)

Who is it that overcomes the world? Only he who **believes** that Jesus is *the Son of God*.

Everyone who **believes** that Jesus is the Messiah has been <u>born from God</u>.

1 John 5:1a (GW)

⇒ When you have a <u>fact</u>-based faith, the object of your believing can be <u>known</u>!

... I <u>know</u> whom I have **believed**... 2 Ti 1:12b (CSB) Believing "in his name." (The "name" represents the person. We must accept him for all that he is, and respond appropriately.)

Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of

John 1:12 (NIV)

John 3:18 (CSB)

But these are written so that you may **believe** that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by **believing** you may have life *in his name*.

Anyone who believes in him is not

condemned, but anyone who does not

believe is already condemned, because he

has not believed in the name of the one

and only Son of God.

John 20:31 (CSB)

And this is his command: to **believe** <u>in the name</u> of his Son, Jesus Christ, and to love one another as he commanded us.

1 John 3:23 (NIV)

⇒ Believing the things he <u>did</u> (and their significance).

JESUS WAS SINLESS IN ALL THAT HE DID

Who among you can convict me of sin?

John 8:46a (CSB)

He was tempted in every way that we are, but he didn't sin.

Hebrews 4:15b (GW)

JESUS' HEALING MIRACLES WERE PICTURES OF SPIRITUAL REALITIES

[Example: Physical healing \Rightarrow spiritual healing.]

"Receive your sight; your faith has healed you."

Lk 18:42b (NET) "Healed" = "saved" or "delivered."

The gospels give special emphasis to Jesus' miracles. They were signs to the Jesus, pointing to who Jesus was. *But most didn't pay attention to the signs.*

[If] you refuse to believe me, then at least believe the things that I'm doing. Then you will know and recognize that the Father is in me and that I am in the Father."

John 10:38b (GW)

⇒ Believing the things he <u>said</u> (and their significance).

THERE WAS SOMETHING SPECIAL ABOUT THE THINGS JESUS SAID!

THAT THE RELIGIOUS

LEADERS HAD!

WE SHOULD NOT
HAVE THE DISBELIEF
Your don't believe

SOMETIMES HIS WORDS
WERE PROPHETIC, AND
THE PEOPLE WOULD
UNDERSTAND AND

The temple guards answered, "No human has ever spoken like this man."

John 7:46 (GW)

If I have told you about earthly things and you don't believe, how will you believe if I tell you about heavenly things?

John 3:12 (CSB)

After he came back to life, his disciples remembered that he had said this. So they believed the Scripture and this statement that Jesus had made.

John 2:22 (GW)

⇒ "Believing in Jesus" – trusting him to do what he has promised.

We must accept as true whatever Scripture says about
Jesus – who he is, what he accomplished, etc.
But we must also trust him to <u>do</u> what he has promised
he will do.

"... everyone who **believes** in him receives <u>forgiveness of sins</u> through his name."

Acts 10:43b (NIV)

"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you and your family will be <u>saved</u>." Acts 16:31b (GW)

Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the goal of your faith, the <u>salvation</u> of your souls.

1 Peter 1:8-9 (NIV)

⇒ Believing/trusting Jesus as "Lord." (= The one who *rules* over us.)

They answered,
"Believe in the <u>Lord</u>
Jesus, and you and
your family will be
saved."

Acts 16:31 (GW)

For if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is <u>Lord</u> and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

Romans 10:9 (NLT)

... the $\underline{\textit{Lord}},$ in whom they had put their trust.

Acts 14:23b (NIV)

"... we [= Jews] believe that we are saved through the grace of the <u>Lord</u> Jesus in the same way they [= gentiles] are."

Acts 15:11b (CSB)

THIS IS WHY THE APOSTLES OFTEN CALLED THEMSELVES "SERVANTS" OR "SLAVES."

Paul, a slave/servant of Jesus Christ...

Romans 1:1 ("servant" and "slave" are both common ways to translate the word)

The SIGNIFICANCE of our JESUS focus?

The "Jesus" of the Bible is so much more than even the "best" "Jesus" the world has to offer.

This is because we can discover the <u>real</u> Jesus only in the Bible.

The "Jesus" of the Bible:

At the beginning of history, this Jesus created us (John 1:3).

At the center point of history, this Jesus died and came back to life for us.

At the end of history, this Jesus is coming back for us.

Everything about Jesus is a reason to trust him!

OUR MISSION!!

Those who have this type of faith are on a firm foundation.
They will receive what God has promised them.



Let us <u>pursue</u> this type of faith... and not be lazy about it!

We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised.

Hebrews 6:12 (NIV)
