➤ The word "law" is used <u>many</u> ways.



People often <u>ignore the</u> <u>context</u> – which results in many misunderstandings and false teachings.

"LAWS OF THE HEART"

GUIDING OR CONTROLLING LAWS (PRINCIPLES)

LAWS (RULES) INVENTED BY PEOPLE



THE WORD "LAW" IS USED MANY WAYS?



- YES! That is why we need to pay attention to the context.
- There are <u>many</u> Scriptures that associate the word "law" with our freedom as saved people, so we need to understand the relationship between the two concepts.

If we pay attention to CONTEXT, we will understand why some passages <u>affirm</u> "law" and other passages <u>oppose</u> it.

- * The same word may be used to describe two different concepts.
- $\ensuremath{\diamond}$ People may have different reasons or motives when using the word.



 It is <u>this</u> "law" that Paul describes as <u>holy</u>, <u>spiritual</u>, <u>good</u>, and something we <u>uphold</u>. (Verses shown previously.)

HERE ARE SOME VERSES (AND RELATED CONCEPTS)
THAT SHOW THE CONNECTION BETWEEN
OBEYING THE MORAL LAW AND FREEDOM.



FIRST, WE MUST UNDERSTAND THAT <u>GOD</u> FREES US; AND HE SHOWS US WHAT IT MEANS TO BE "FREE."

1) God CALLED us to be FREE.

- The focus here is on God's role in our salvation and how it will affect the way we live.
- God's "calling" includes the necessary life-changes that make it possible.
- ✓ He accomplished this freedom by means of what Jesus did on the cross.

All praise to him who loves us and has **freed** us from our sins by shedding his blood for us.

Rev. 1:5b (NLT)

2) Scripture tells us about things that are <u>incompatible</u> with this FREEDOM.

- ✓ Attempts to <u>earn</u> our salvation by obeying the "law."
 - The context shows that Paul is referring mainly to the ceremonial law (religious rituals); but <u>no law</u> can save us, since we have all sinned.
 - Our only recourse is to <u>trust God</u> for salvation Romans 3:23; Galatians 3:10-14; etc.
 - Attempting to <u>earn</u> salvation by the law turns it into a <u>slave master</u> – resulting in the <u>opposite</u> of freedom!

It is for **freedom** that Christ has set us **free**. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

Galatians 5:1 (NIV)

[Things that are incompatible with FREEDOM.]

- ✓ Using "freedom" as an excuse for sinning.
 - Genuine freedom affects <u>all</u> our relationships with both God and people – resulting in love, honor, respect, etc.

Live as free people, but don't hide behind your freedom when you do evil. Instead, use your freedom to serve God. Honor everyone. Love your brothers and sisters in the faith. Fear God. Honor the emperor [= government leaders].

1 Peter 2:16-17 (GW)

[Incompatible: Using "freedom" as an excuse for sinning.]

<u>Genuine</u> freedom replaces sinfulness with love for other people!

You were indeed called to be **free**, brothers and sisters. Don't turn this **freedom** into an excuse for your corrupt nature to express itself. Rather, <u>serve</u> <u>each other through love</u>.

Galatians 5:13 (GW)

- WARNING: <u>False</u> teachers may promise "freedom," while they are encouraging people to sin.
- ... they entice people who are just escaping from those who live in error. They promise them **freedom**, ...

2 Peter 2:18b-19a (NIV)

THEREFORE, WE ARE TO PURSUE FREEDOM AND LIVE-OUT THE TRUTH (= OBEDIENCE).

(These two concepts go together.)

Obeying the truth results in freedom.

It is only through obedience that we can really "know" the truth.

Jesus said to the people who believed in him, "You are truly my disciples if you keep obeying my teachings. And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

John 8:31-32 (NLT)

 After this (verses 34+), Jesus warns us that people who <u>don't</u> obey the truth are <u>slaves</u> to sin.

TO THE <u>UNSAVED</u>, THE MORAL LAW MAY BE JUST A "LIST OF RULES." TO THE <u>SAVED</u>, IT TAKES ON AN ENTIRELY DIFFERENT DIMENSION.

1) God embeds his laws in our hearts.

"This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, declares the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts and will write them on their minds, ..."

Hebrews 10:16 (ISV)

- This refers to the "New Covenant," which Jesus accomplished on the cross.
- The result? The moral law changes from being an external list of rules to the desire of our lives!

2) Here are some verses that describe this new perspective:

✓ God's Law = Christ's Law.

... not outside the law of God, but subject to the law of Christ ...

1 Corinthians 9:21b (LEB)

- The emphasis here is on the <u>moral</u> law. It is contrasted to the religious ceremonial laws that the Jews followed – mentioned in v. 20.
- (Note that Jesus also summarizes the moral law as an expression of <u>love</u> for God and people – Matthew 22:37-40.)

[Verses that describe this new perspective.]

The moral law is summarized by the "Royal Law" of "Love your neighbor as yourself."

But if you fulfill the royal law as expressed in this scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. ... For [God] said, "Do not commit adultery," ... "Do not murder."

James 2:8, 11a (NET)

✓ Because of this connection, the moral law is associated with freedom.

... the perfect law that gives **freedom**, ... / ... the law that gives **freedom**, ...

James 1:25b; 2:12b (NIV)

WHAT should we conclude?



In past weeks, we have been focusing on FREEDOM from sin.

> *Obedience to the moral law is the <u>context</u> in which we <u>define</u> FREEDOM!

This is why we no longer have to be *slaves* to sin!

- THE WORLD: "free" to sin
 - i.e., sin is their master.
- GOD'S PEOPLE: free to do what is right
 - i.e., God is our master!

In other words...

We are FREE to live **holy** lives

 FREE to live according to the principles of <u>love</u>, which are expressed by the moral <u>law!</u>

THEREFORE:

- We don't have to sin!
- We can say with confidence:

No temptation has come upon you except what is common to humanity.

But God is faithful; he will not allow you to be

But God is faithful; he will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation he will also provide a way out so that you may be able to bear it.

1 Corinthians 10:13 (CSB)
